The land became a Provincial Heritage Property in the spring of 2005. Oospenia Spring was named in commemoration of the Doukhobors by the Geographic Names Board.



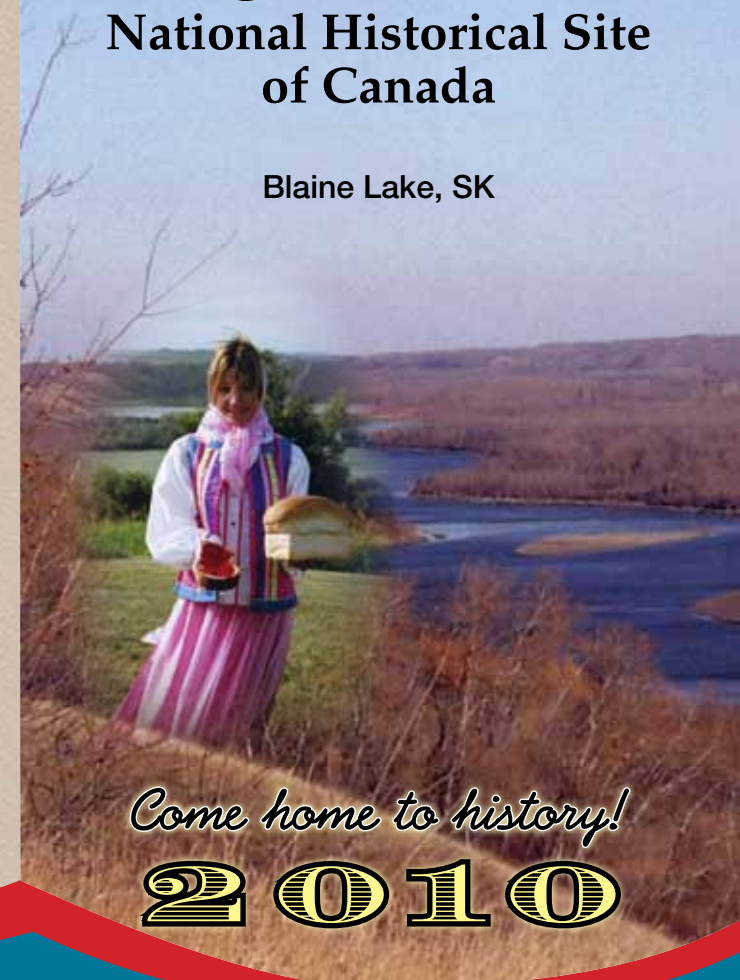
